The New England Carpenters' Union Apprenticeship Program provides accepted applicants a 48 month scholarship to learn our trade.

**Earn as you Learn:** Apprentices earn a pro-rated salary, which increases as they



advance through the program, while receiving training to become Journeyman Carpenters with the New England Regional Council of Carpenters.

## ON-THE-JOB TRAINING & CLASSROOM INSTRUCTION

Carpentry is a profession which historically has been handed down from one skilled craftsman to the next.



Apprentices complete On-the-Job-Training (OJT) "work experience" required to graduate the apprenticeship program and become a journeyman. After completing the program you will be the best trained and well

rounded carpenter available for employment in this industry.

Apprentices also complete classroom and shop instruction at the New England Carpenters Training Center



located on a 30 acre campus in Millbury, MA.

Graduates of our Apprentice Program receive preferred admission, reduced tuition and college credits towards an Associates or Bachelors Degree in Construction Management .

## Apprenticeship Program Requirements in all New England States

1. Must be 18 years old and physically able to perform work of the trade.
2. Must submit to drug testing prior to being accepted into the program.
3. Must have a high school diploma or GED equivalent.
